Kittatinny Rambles Hike #3: Boyd Big Tree Preserve Conservation Area/Spangler Lands/Hocker Park Birding with Central PA Conservancy

Enjoy a leisurely paced, moderately challenging four-and-a-half-mile birding hike with the Central Pennsylvania Conservancy through three contiguous areas of protected land – the Boyd Big Tree Preserve

KTA Organization News & Updates

KTA helped a wide demographic of hikers get out on the trails safely and successfully this May

KTA had an awesome hike at White Rocks Trail in Boiling Springs with the youth from Hope Station! The group was able to receive backpacks and hiking poles through our mini-grant program and for some of them, this was their first time on a "real" hike - making this experience extra special! We're honored to help raise up the next generation of hikers and to have such a great connection in the community.

KTA was asked to attend a hike with the Harrisburg Young Professionals group as part of their "After Work Hike" series to meet other HYP members and enjoy nature with a leisurely hike through Detweiler Park. It was great to see so many young professionals gathering for some outdoor recreation!

KTA hiker leader, Jim Foster, guided March's Backpacking 101 Workshop graduates on a backpacking trip to put their new knowledge into practice. The trip was a success and every hiker returned with a smile on their face.







KTA stood up for the Susquehanna Riverlands Conservation Landscape and Cuff's Run in York County

Hikers share that the Susquehanna Riverlands Conservation Landscape is one of the most remote, rugged, and beautiful sections of the trail along the river in the heart of the Susquehanna Riverlands. Over the last

ten years, local, state, and federal partners, and private investors have invested more than \$100 million to protect this landscape as a destination for tourism, outdoor recreation, and ecological restoration to offset habitat loss from unsustainable development.

York Energy Storage is proposing to destroy the remote and wild undeveloped riverfront around Cuff's Run in York County by building a pumped storage hydro facility. This project will alter the landscape which includes immense recreational opportunities, hundreds of acres of prime farmland, 600 acres of forests, and approximately 49 properties to produce power in an area already monopolized by power production. Major threats to water usage, water quality, wildlife, and aquatic life are obviously apparent.

Keystone Trails Association joined in signing a letter in opposition to this project along with a coalition led by Lower Susquehanna Riverkeeper Association, Lancaster Conservancy, Susquehanna National Heritage Area, Farm & Natural Lands Trust of York County, and Cuff's Run Alliance.

KTA supported project aspiring to reintroduce the American Marten into Pennsylvania's forests

"Wildlife viewing is part of what makes [hiking] experiences special," shared Brook Lenker, Executive Director, in a letter of support to the



PA Game Commission for the reintroduction of the American into our state. "Spotting an American Marten would surely enrich anyone's adventure and expand their appreciation of the natural world." This project is headed by Tom Keller, Furbearer Biologist of the PA Game Commission, who attended KTA's Spring Hiking Weekend and provided a lecture-style learning session about the American Marten.
